The AGC Georgia Skills Challenge series was a big hit in 2022 with over 2,100 student competitors and student observers attending from 90 schools. The series events were hosted in Augusta, Gainesville, Macon, Marietta, Moultrie, Rome, and Statesboro. The core competitions for the Challenges are Carpentry, Electrical, Masonry, Plumbing, and Welding with Blueprint Reading, Heavy Equipment, Roofing, Fine Furniture/ Woodworking, HVAC, and other disciplines being offered at select Challenges.

The annual events are held in the fourth quarter of each calendar year and serve as the qualifier for five construction competitions that move on to compete at the challenge in Augusta, visit SkillsUSA Georgia State Leadership & Skills https://rwallen.com/skills-challenge/ Conference (SLSC).

During the 2022 Skills Challenge series hundreds of influencers including state legislators, school superintendents, high school counselors, mayors, school board members, and leaders from the Department of Education and Technical College System of Georgia were in attendance.

Anger and Workplace Violence

Preventing Uncontrolled Anger on the Jobsite

The Department of Labor estimates that approximately 2 million US workers are victims of non-fatal workplace violence every year. Workplace violence can cause unnecessary stress, fear, and a fear for one's own safety. Victims and observers become less productive, are prone to distractions, experience lower morale, and may become suspicious of one another.

Anger is a normal human emotion and a response to dangers or threats. It could be a physical threat or a threat to our pride, self-control, conceptions of fairness, and other triggers. While becoming angry isn't wrong, uncontrolled anger can lead to lashing out and unacceptable aggressive behaviors.

The good news is that learning is just as normal as anger, and we can learn to avoid problems associated with anger. Here are some tips to manage workplace anger in yourself and others:

Learn to identify and manage your own feelings of anger: Learn and understand your own triggers so that you can identify them quickly. What conversations, behaviors, or situations tend to make you angry? Understanding these triggers will help you come up with strategies to prevent violent action. You may need help from a trusted friend or professional counselor to fully understand your own anger. Learn what you feel like with your anger is intensifying so you can take steps to control it.

Learn how to communicate. You need to be able to voice your frustrations without cursing, screaming, or blaming. Focus on solving the problem or issue instead of laying blame and finding fault in others. It may take practice to learn how to talk about your feelings calmly, but calm solutions are always more effective than useless screaming and yelling.

Find healthy ways to de-stress outside of work: People are more likely to get angry when they are stressed. Hobbies, exercise, and mindfulness can help reduce the stress levels in your body.

If you ever feel threatened by a co-worker, don't retaliate: Don't respond to anger with anger, since that can escalate the situation. If you feel threatened or like there's a potential for violence, calmly walk away. Notify your supervisor or call 911, depending on the situation.
